

Writes 13 or more Alphabet Letters,
Upper or Lower Case, from memory

A.) Strategy to teach skill: As a warm up, ask the child to write out the alphabet looking at the alphabet (see next page). This primes the child's memory. Next, give the child this page and ask them to write as many letters as they can from memory. Goal 13 or more letters.



Practice writing upper and lower case letters in the box below the letters. The boxes are small to help a child practice writing at the proper size. Writing is an application skill that takes much practice to master. Practice first with letters shown to help "prime" the child.
