30 Write Right Sight Words Goal: child can find 20 words consistently

To teach sight words: Read and re-read repetitive stories to your child. Your child has heard common sight words in conversation and when read stories for years. Now is the time to convert that knowledge into the ability to read and write. Once your child has part of the text of repetitious books memorized, play "I spy" with common sight words that are repetitious in the text. To play, write a sight word like "go" on a post-it note and let the child look at the post-it while searching the text for that word on every page of the book before that page of the story is read.

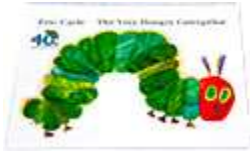


2. Bark, George by Jules Feiffer

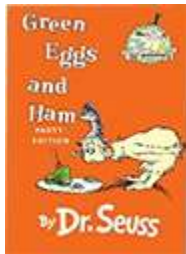
